



Bonsall Woman's Club, organized in 1980, is an intermediate club in the semi-rural community of Bonsall, an unincorporated area of North San Diego County. We have members from surrounding communities, ranging in age from young mothers to ladies in their active 90's. Our mission is to participate in activities for the betterment of our members, community and country. We help our youth, elderly and needy through financial aid and service.

The most important event that the Bonsall Woman's Club sponsored in 2023 was a joint venture with the local school district. Two members co-chaired "Stages of Inspiration": 2023 Art Contest and Show, working with a committee of eight members and five school district administrators and teachers. The committee worked for six months to organize a combined art show for club members and students in three categories: crafts, fine arts and photography. A community sponsor donated \$3,000, which was primarily used to purchase art-related prizes for winning students, though some funds were also allocated for supplies and publicity.

As this was the first event of its type in our community, potential turnout was difficult to foresee during the planning stages. Any doubt of success was removed when the doors opened and a steady stream of eager attendees entered the middle school where the Art Show was held. Featuring 201 art show entries, representing 30 club members and students from kindergarten through twelfth grade, the Art Show attracted a standing-room-only crowd. Club members and students alike cast their ballots to determine winners in multiple age brackets and art show categories. Two local art gallery professionals selected the "Best in Show" awards. The "Stages of Inspiration" theme was embraced at many levels: Literally, the art was staged for the show, and so too were the musical performances on stage that entertained while judging and ballot counting took place. "Stages" also represented the lives of participants (who ranged in age from 5 – 98), and the stages in their lives of when they were inspired to create art.

All of the "oooohs" and "aaaaahs" that were audible in the room resonated in the hearts of those who attended. The best measure of success though was that the very tired committee spent an extra hour after the event ended that night to discuss plans for doing an Art Show next year. "Stages of Inspiration: 2024" is in the planning stages now.
